Mrs. Kaufman, of Cleveland, has served as national organizational chairman of Pioneer Women and also was official representative to the 1946 World Jewish Congress. A forest in Israel was dedicated in her honor in 1955 by Hadassah, Mizrahi Women, B'nai B'rith and Pioneer Women in recognition of her work. She has traveled overseas in behalf of the United Jewish Appeal and was in Israel attending a special seminar at the time of the Sinai campaign.

**SHE ALSO** is active in Cleveland community projects. She is a board member of the Jewish Community Federation, the Board of Jewish Education, a member of Jewish Family Service, co-chairman of the Women's Division of Jewish Welfare Fund and vice-president of the Jewish Community Council.

All proceeds of the affair will be used for Pioneer Women's projects in Israel.

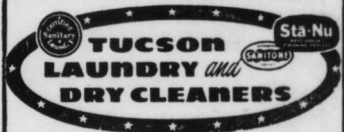
