Through inspiration, hard work and the Golden Age Club at the Center, Camille Bersu has realized a life-long ambition — the rejuvenation of the aged through exercise.

Miss Bersu claims the way to live to be a 100 and feel like 20, is a rigid program of exercising.

And she proves her point. At the age of 65, she claims she can out-walk, out-exercise and out-dance any teenager. She gives a good demonstration of her vitality at the Center in her two exercise classes.

The classes are held each Tuesday and Thursday at 10 a.m. More than 30 Golden Agers are doing their set-up exercises in the Center patio to the militant "1-2-3-4" of Miss Bersu.

When the classes were first started only two or three skeptical Golden Agers turned out for the classes. Now the 'students' are reluctant to quit at the end of class time.

FROM EARLY childhood in Germany, Miss Bersu has been interested in body development. For many years, she studied interpretive dancing under the famed dancer, Mary Wigman, and later opened her own school.

Miss Bersu came to realize that a great artist must learn to breathe properly. From dancing she transferred her interest to the study of breathing and body development. She soon opened her own gymnasium.

But when Hitler came into power, she closed the gym and moved to Vienna where she again took up her crusade for health. Later she traveled in the Far East and there became interested in Yoga.

Now she combines Yoga exercises with her own theories.

In addition to conducting the exercise classes for the Golden Agers, Miss Bersu also directs folk dancing classes for them.

Over the past three years many of the Golden Agers have "found their feet again" and found a new way to stay young.

NEW YORK (JTA)—More than 500 Americans settled in Israel during 1957, it was reported here by Louis Segal, chairman of the Aliyah Department of the Jewish Agency in New York. He emphasized that this is the largest figure in any year since 1951.

World Poll Shows Opinion Favoring Israel Growing

NEW YORK (JTA)—A poll of public opinion in ten countries has revealed that the friends of Israel abroad have increased in the ten years since the Jewish State was established and that generally the numbers of her opponents are small in relation to her friends.

A large number of people queried in the ten countries are still undecided on whether to favor or oppose Israel.

The friends of Israel constitute anywhere from 22 percent to 56 percent of the people polled, while the opponents vary from a low of four percent in Norway and Japan to a high of 17 percent in Britain.

SUPPORT FROM Israel comes from the better educated citizens in each country and in all countries, except Japan and Italy, the majority of university educated people favors Israel.

The poll conducted by the New York Herald Tribune and International Research Associates found the following picture: Norway, 56 percent for Israel, four percent

against; Austria 44 percent for, 12 percent against, Germany 41 percent for, 11 percent against; Belgium, 38 percent for, eight percent against; France 35 percent for, 13 percent against; Italy 24 percent for, 16 percent against, and Japan 22 percent for, four percent against.
